For those of you who successfully complete the Postgraduate Diploma and choose to progress to the Masters (MSc) in Mental Health Care, it continues after Module 6 (exact date TBC).

On **23.09.2024** you will get access to the **iheed** Online Learning Environment and you will attend your first induction session.

Induction is designed to give you everything you need in advance of Module 1 and provide you with valuable guidance in advance of commencing the programme.

By combining classroom-style, self-directed and discussion-based learning, induction week also sets the pace and tone for the weeks and months ahead, offering a window into how the programme will run.

It is an important opportunity to meet with faculty, the academic affairs team and your peers and to familiarise yourself with the programme structure. You will begin to understand academic expectations and identify the supports available to you to achieve the best outcomes.

Student Engagement

This section looks at getting the most from this programme through active engagement, positive participation and honest, open interaction.

In the Classroom

The following rules of engagement apply to all workshops and tutorials:

- 1. Be prepared and be on time.
- 2. Dedicate space and time to your tutorial.
- 3. Know the topic and what is to be covered/discussed
- 4. Remember discretion, all information shared and discussed is confidential.
- 5. Be open and non-judgmental, listen and give feedback in an honest and constructive manner.
- 6. Participate, seek answers, interact with your tutor and classmates.
- 7. Create and apply classroom norms that work for everyone, for example what to do if you arrive late.

Assessments and Written Work

When preparing for and submitting assessments, remember to:

- 1. Observe all due dates.
- 2. Observe the word count for each written submission.
- 3. Choose the appropriate referencing style (Harvard).
- 4. Observe the rules around plagiarism and academic integrity.

5. Familiarise yourself with the circumstances in which capped grades and other penalties may apply.

Dealing with Obstacles

Life events sometimes overtake us, we understand. In the event of a problem with a submission, attendance, or any aspect of your studies, be assured that there is a team in place to help you. The most important thing is to let us know as soon as possible. Do not leave it too late!

Programme Registration

To formally complete your registration with London South Bank University you must have all the following documents submitted by 23.09.2024 (the beginning of Induction Week):

After this point, registration on the January take will not be possible.

1. University Certificate	You must provide us with your original certificate, in English.
2. Identification	You must provide an identification card which has your name, face and date of birth all visible. This is used during the online examinations.
3. Student Contract	You must sign the student contract.

Programme Outputs

- Provide you with a comprehensive overview of mental health nursing to provide an academic underpinning for those seeking to deliver care in this field.
- Equip you with the ability to discuss the biopsychosocial factors underpinning conceptualisation of mental health, common mental issues and provision of care.
- Equip you with the knowledge and skills to understand the experiences of people with mental health problems and to assist and facilitate their journey to recovery.
- Enable you to consider appropriate assessments and treatments for a variety of metal health issues.
- Provide you with the ability to differentiate the clinical presentations of various mental disorders and relevant evidence-based approaches to nursing intervention.
- Integrate the principles of recovery and patient-focused care for mental health nursing practice.

Programme Assessment

Scheme of Assessment

On this programme, assessment may take the form of examinations, written assignments and presentations submitted at the end of each module. Details of the assignments are provided in the section on Module Assessments, page 12.

To achieve a good result in written assessments, students must demonstrate:

- 1. **Knowledge** of the subject
- 2. Ability to critically evaluate the literature
- 3. Appropriate referencing and structure throughout

Make sure to join the induction week session on Academic Writing for a refresher on academic writing, an overview of the Module 1 essay question and some information on Turnitin – the software used to determine plagiarism and tips on how to improve your essays.

Please note the following:

Passing grade: An overall pass mask of 50% must be achieved in both essay and examination.

<u>Due dates</u>: The assignment due dates are highlighted in your timetable. Extension requests must be made no later than 7 days before the due date. The penalty for late submissions is a 5% deduction for each day. If an assignment is submitted late, and there is no extension request, it will be considered a DNS (did not submit) and result in a grade of 0%.

Resubmissions: If an assignment is failed, there is a chance for resubmission or repeat.

<u>Compensation details:</u> All resubmissions are automatically capped at the pass mark of 50% and where an element of a module is capped, it results in a cap on the entire module.

A failed resubmission/repeat will result in the removal from the course. Appeals can be made to the Mitigating Circumstances panel prior to an Exam Board.

Fit to sit / Mitigating Circumstances:

By submitting an assessment or presenting for an exam, you are declaring yourself "fit to sit" the assessment and it will be marked accordingly. If you experience a problem with an exam, video submission, attendance or any aspect of your studies, please get in contact with the Mental Health Programme Support team (mentalhealthsupport@iheed.org) as soon as possible to discuss the options available to you.

Life events may sometimes overtake us, we understand. If there are mitigating circumstances (MC) that prevent you from meeting a deadline, or which you feel may have affected your performance in an exam, you may submit a claim of mitigating circumstances to iheed.

This must be submitted prior to your results being released and needs to be evidenced by supporting documentation. Claims need to be timely, relevant and severe and beyond the scope of normal life events.

The MC will be considered at the next available Board of Examiners meeting and, if successful, you may be granted an exceptional third attempt at the assessment/examination.

If a third attempt is granted, participants will re-join the course at the point at which their progress was paused. If the third attempt is not granted, the permanent withdrawal of the participant from the course will be confirmed at the Board of Examiners.

Results:

Results are typically released 3-4 weeks after an exam session.

All results are provisional until ratified and confirmed by the Board of Examiners.


Programme Online Learning Environment

All the programme materials can be found in the iheed Online Learning Environment (OLE) – Canvas.

You will all be issued log in details at the start of your Induction Week which will grant you access to all the programme materials. Once you sign in, you will come to this **Homepage**.



On the very left-hand menu you can see Account, Dashboard, Courses, Calendar, Inbox, and Help.



Under **Account**, you can post a **profile picture** (1) – this will appear by your discussion posts, and it is a nice way to familiarise yourselves with your group, even while working on the self-directed material; you can choose how frequent your **notifications** (2) are – you can ask to receive a daily or weekly report of events, you can ask to receive a notification when any post is made in a discussion you are involved in, or you can switch it off entirely! The **settings** (3) include setting your time zone*, changing password and editing preferred contact methods.

*Please ensure you have set the time zone correctly as Canvas will create a bespoke calendar for each student. As you may be in different time zones, this could cause confusion if not set properly.

The next two **Dashboard** and **Courses** will bring you to the same page – providing a breakdown to subject/topics and to the content for each module, starting with the **Student Orientation**, we recommend that you go through the Orientation Module during Induction Week.


Each Module of your programme has the weekly topics and number of pages on display. This will allow you to track your progress through the self-directed course materials.



Each week there will be a series of **Learning Outcomes**, and throughout the programme material you will be introduced to Reflective Questions, Case Studies, and Interactive Multimedia to help guide you through the week. At the end of the week, we will meet online for a tutorial.

The **Calendar** is where you will find your programme timetable. Zoom links for each of your online tutorial sessions will be provided here, as well as the dates for your exams. The Calendar is directly linked to your *time zone settings*, so please ensure that you are registered to the correct time zone so that you know when your classes are on. (By default, time zone is set to GMT.)






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
You can sync the Canvas calendar to any calendar you use (iCal, Outlook etc) by clicking on *Calendar Feed* — this means any changes/edits to calendar events will be highlighted in real-time.

The **Inbox** allows you to contact the tutor, programme administrator or any fellow participants. Your Canvas messaging is synced to your preferred contact email as chosen in your **Settings**. Important class information will be sent to all students via Canvas inbox and by a supplementary email.

You may also receive **Course Announcements** – these will be displayed at the top of the page when you log in to Canvas.



Your programme name will be highlighted in the top-left corner, and all emails are displayed on the left. Click on the pencil to **compose** a new mail, the single arrow to **reply** directly or the double arrow to **reply all**.



The **Help** button is for **technical issues** – if there is an unresponsive page or a broken link, you can let the IT team know here. For more general queries, please contact the Academic Affairs team by email.

With the secondary navigation menu, the important ones to pay attention to are:

- Home, Discussions, Grades and Resources.

Home will always bring you to the default landing page. From here you can navigate to the section of the programme that you need to get to for any given week.

Discussions is your student forum – as well as the *weekly discussion* to complement the self-guided materials, you can also find some *pinned discussions*.

After the online induction, we will publish an *Introductory Discussion* as well, where you can post a little bit of information about yourself and get to know your fellow participants.

Grades will be the space in Canvas where you can find your results for each module assessment exam. You will be notified when these grades are published.

One of the most useful links you will need during the Postgraduate Diploma/Master of Science is the Resources page. Here you will find a list of recorded sessions and slides/materials from the tutorials.

We monitor attendance of tutorials for our own records; but in case you miss a session, a recording will be made available as well as the resources/materials used in that class.
